## **Travel planning:**

To get to Luleå:

By plane: Both SAS and Norwegian have several (in total about 10 flights per day scheduled from Stockholm Arlanda airport to Lulea airport (fewer during weekends), and with a flight time of about 1 hour 10 minutes it may be preferred over the 14 hour night train.

The airport is situated in Kallax (and thus is commonly called Kallax airport), and lies about 7 km from Luleå city centre, which is accessible via Luleå's public transport (bus number 4), shuttle bus or taxi. The shuttle bus to the center costs 25 SEK (about 3 Euro) each way, and it's departures are based on the flight schedule.

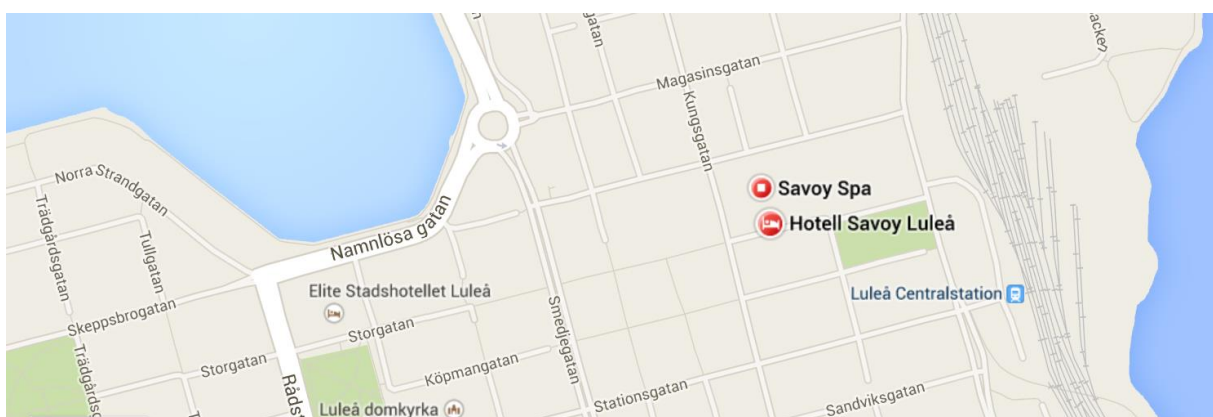
By train: The national railroad company SJ has a few passenger trains scheduled each night between Lulea and Stockholm and Gothenburg. Stockholm is about a 14 hour train, and Gothenburg is over 18 hours; consider paying extra for a bed while booking.

Get around in Luleå: A fast, cheap and comfortable way of getting to the different parts of the city, is by using the local bus traffic (LLT). Local buses are usually 25 SEK per trip. If you plan on making more than 4 trips, buy a 3-day tourist pass from the tourist office, which allows you unlimited travel on local buses for 100 SEK. You can buy the pass already at the airport at "Mat & Fika" in the arrival hall..

## **What to do in Luleå – sightseeing and adventures**

- The Unesco World Heritage Gammelstad, Sweden's largest church town, was the medieval centre of northern Sweden. The 1492-built stone Nederluleå church has a reredos worthy of a cathedral and a wonderfully opulent pulpit. Four hundred and twenty-four wooden houses (where the pioneers stayed during weekend pilgrimages) and six church stables remain.
- Norrbotten museum: Besides the extensive displays on the history of Norrbotten, Norrbottens Museum is worth a visit for the Sami section alone, with its engrossing collection of photos, tools, and dioramas depicting traditional reindeer-herding Sami life, as well as a nomad tent for kids. The little ones will love the recreated 19th-century playrooms.
- You can take a car tour over the ice roads from Luleå out to the islands of the Luleå Archipelago. These roads are built and maintained each winter by the local council to ensure safety. On the island of Hindersön is the small hotel and cafe called Jopikgården where you can enjoy a relaxing morning afternoon tea or lunch.
